# **Caring For Africa and AIDS Victims**

Thanks to all who committed to being World Vision child sponsors on Hope Sunday back in June. Fifteen Rwandan children whose lives have been impacted by AIDS now have opportunity for education, medical care, clean water and food. Care is also being provided for their parents if they are still living.

In a program called "The Hope Initiative," Concerts of Prayer Greater New York (COPGNY) has partnered with World Vision International to do something about the global AIDS/HIV crisis. After much prayer, COP-GNY chose Rwanda as a new World Vision initiative to do all we can to witness to Christ and help resolve the AIDS crisis. The goal is for our area to sponsor tens of thousands of children, many who are AIDS orphans living in severe poverty. The 3 year plan is to gain more and more new sponsors, to adopt a community project like

digging wells or establishing schools, and taking visiting teams to the country.

From Oct 31– Nov. 12 Pastor Allen Kemp and Dr. George Cox will go with about 20 other pastors and leaders from this area to visit Rwanda and get a first hand look at the HIV/AIDS crisis there. We will come back with a vision and a plan for how local churches here can do a much greater work there. Please pray for us!

#### Something Greater Than The Temple

"Something Greater Than the Temple: Rediscovering Jesus' Biblical Humanism" by Steve Notley Sundays 9:15 a.m.

Jesus' first century contemporaries searched the Scriptures to understand how God wanted them to live in difficult days. They lived in a time of military threat that witnessed the suffering of the righteous and the apparent prosperity of those who oppressed God's people. Attacks came not only from without but also from within that gave rise to communal divisions and strife. In these difficult days people sought to understand both how God would redeem His people, and in the meantime how they should maintain a godly attitude towards each other--and even towards their oppressors. We want to explore the ideas put forward by Jesus and His contemporaries, not only to shed fresh light on well-known New Testament passages, but also to hear afresh God's call on us to live out the Gospel in our generation. Topics include:

2. Whose Sin Brought the Tower Down? Recognizing Universal Human Frailty3. Are You the One Who is to
